Items picked up from newsletter:

#### Gingerbread House Fundraiser

- Event netted \$800; \$565 from gingerbread sales (\$348.50 cost); \$400 from raffle
- For this year, more guidelines needed around take home, decorate, bring back only allowed to use the items in the box
- \$10/box; limited quantities; can only use items within box
- Refreshments: hot chocolate and cookies
- Craft: Candy-Cane reindeer

## Christmas Concert/Family Night Event (raffle and volunteers)

- Big box stores contacted: Fortino's, Longo's, Firehouse Subs, Canadian Tire
- Feedback from previous years was that parents wanted an event more attracted to older students
- There will be an evening event; primary Christmas concert for grades 1-3 during the day on Thursday December 13<sup>th</sup> at 9:30am for parents; during the evening the Kindergarten class will have a one hour event 6-7pm (song and craft); addendum to the evening such as raffle or other items to extend beyond kindergarten group.

#### Raffle:

#### Other
